So it was a couple of months ago that while in Denver visiting family I went to a Sunday night meeting. This particular gathering had a lot of laughter and chatting going on prior to the meeting starting. (Always a good sign). This also happened to be a "Speak Up" meeting, which means after the lead is given, if you want to comment, you "Speak Up."

As the comments were being shared I heard a fella say something to the effect of "No one gets up in the morning and says I think I'll go to AA and see what's going on".

Well, next thing I know, it was MY voice saying "HEY-I'M THAT GUY".

You see, years before I was told that alcohol was an issue for me, and in spite of being twelve stepped by a family member for years and that I was drinking daily, it's because of a neighbor (also a drinking buddy) that came here, that I'm here today.

I badgered him with questions about what went on, what it was all about what happened. His answers were always "I can't tell you! You have to go see for yourself" Then one day he set the hook and reeled me in with, "You won't believe who's there". That did it. Now I HAVE to go to see who all the drunks are in town!

And that is the honest reason I came to my first meeting of Alcoholics Anonymous in August of 1986. To see who was there.

- It's taken me a five year dry spell with no meetings, one relapse of about eight months, (not a requirement) and a conscious decision to get drunk (I was out of town, wasn't honest with my granger and blooms will know) to put together along years continuous solution.
- 4 with my sponsor and No-one will know) to put together eleven years continuous sobriety.
- 4 I could not have done it without a loving God that works anonymously in my life, AA and all that comes with living a sober life to the best of my ability on a daily basis.

Because of all that, I AM THAT GUY!




