### A CHILDS CONDITION

I am a woman who has grown up around these rooms of Alcoholics Anonymous ever since the age of 5, in 1995. My grandfather is still a current member and would bring me all the time to the meetings. The journey I adventured through going in and out all the old rooms. The distinct smell of coffee, cigarettes, and cedar all around. It was absolutely magical to me. I can specifically remember one Christmas party at the Des Plaines Alano Club, years ago, I was dancing and singing all sorts of songs. Songs of Christian and Jewish alike. And none of that mattered at all to me. It was just pure joy and acceptance. I never once saw these people as malnourished and scam artists. Just simply lovely people.

Now today I am a grateful member of the AA unity. And a lot of that childlike magic has faded fast and few for me. I search constantly for an out and quick fill to this deflation I call my life. With grown up ideas and grown up conceptions I have easily cut myself off from others but especially my Higher Power. There was always something to concern myself with and to be better at. I felt uncomfortable because the sole source of my comfort, my Higher Power was put on the back sliders by ME!!

The Eleventh Step emphasizes the words "prayer and meditation to IM-PROVE our conscious contact with God." Well, I love to meditate and I have been known to talk more than I should. So it's that simple. AND YES, YES IT IS! As an adult I overanalyze and try to pick the best method of delivery but enough is enough. A good friend in the program recently told me "just go to Him as a child" So I do. As a child what I have to say is, "help me." "help me everyday to get up and walk forward." "Guide me, I get lost a lot," and "love all those who I especially don't get to tell that to them myself." My world has begun to evolve.

I read something in a book a while back, and it was written on spiritual axioms. It simply read something along the lines of, "It is not the even that which matters, but the persons spiritual condition." It's clear why AA seemed fantastical when I was younger, I am still just an infant in AA, and young at age, but I firmly believe it is my job to take each step forward with "God Consciousness" or more simply "walk in a relationship of love with everyone" That is my prayer.
