Thought for this issue

I know in my heart that only you can restore me to sanity if I am just willing to stop doubting your power. I humbly ask that you help me to understand that it is more powerful to believe than not to believe and that you are either everything or nothing. (p. 52:2, 52:3, 53:1, 53:2)

AA is the easier softer way.

I am both an alcoholic and a drug addict. My drugs of choice are cocaine combined with alcohol. My problem began at age fourteen and ran rampant through the time I was forty-five. I grew up in a good home with an above average income. I was raised with great morals and values. I was quite spoiled when young and got bailed out of all my troubles making it easy to drink and use for a career length of time.

I enjoyed my life when I was younger but I began running with a bad crowd. I dated a drug dealer for eleven years which made heavy use and accessibility easy. By the time I was in my forties my health began to fail and the fun was surely wearing off. I grew tired, got diabetes and got in a very severe car accident. I had to have my last rites read as I was dying through blood trauma. Even with all the bad things happening around me I could not stop using and drinking. I had no God. My God and idol was God Cocaine and King Alcohol. I was beaten, bruised and broken when I entered "The program". It was mid-winter and I began this wonderful experience by going on my computer to an AA site called "In the rooms." I did this for two and a half months before going to Serenity House in the spring of 2011.

I felt awkward at first but I knew this was the last resort. It was this or death. I was no longer social as I had been isolating for years. I felt filthy and unclean. I wallowed in a dreaded darkness beyond comprehension. I existed only at night for years so daylight was odd to me. I didn't want to be seen in the daylight out of fear that someone would see who I really was: cold and lost and callous. My family (who is everything to me) was ravaged and blackened. I no longer had friends.

Now I could say it's all different. My family is repairing itself. I'm repairing myself through the program and I have a guiding loving God (not cocaine) Ha Ha! My eyes see in a new light. I see beauty in things I could never see. With prayers of gratitude I thank my God for everyone I have in my life and how much good fortune I have. I am slowly beginning to make a few friends and socialize again. This hasn't been easy for me but hey nothing good is! I often hear at the meetings, "Keep coming back." I am a stable happy woman just for today. Amen. Jaci A.
