bution" (formerly "Remember November") to the A.A. General Service Office (G.S.O.).

Some members contribute a dollar for each year of their sobriety, while others give a penny for each day of their sobriety — the amount is up to each individual; however the G.S.O. cannot accept more than \$3,000 per year from any one member.

NOTE: Northern Illinois Area 20 prefers that individual groups contribute directly to the G.S.O. so that the Area 20 treasurer is not burdened with this task.

Birthday contribution envelopes are available at no charge from G.S.O. (FR-2 for group contributions, and FR-5 for individual members), or birthday and recurring contributions can be made on G.S.O.'s A.A. website at https://www.aa.org.

Dear Patrick:

Welcome to your new assignment as Conference Coordinator. I hope that you find this assignment to be a good experience for you.

I am writing on behalf of the Bourbonnais Terrace Group (District 52) and Area 20, Northern Illinois. We are requesting that the Trustees Literature Committee place the following on the agenda for the 2019 GSC:

That work begins on the development of a fifth edition of the book Alcoholics Anonymous.

The Bourbonnais Terrace Group passed a motion to bring this to the Area Assembly. It was brought, as a motion, to our Area Assembly on September 15th, 2018 and passed unanimously.

Background

The editions of the book Alcoholics Anonymous have been published in somewhat regular intervals:

The first edition was published in 1939,

The second edition 16 years later in 1955,

The third edition 21 years later in 1976

The fourth edition 25 years later in 2001

If work was begun now we would expect to see the fifth edition in 2020 or 2021, 19 to 20 years since the last edition first came out.
