As Peter Sees It

At one of my favorite meetings, we read the last two paragraphs on page 162 of the BB. I have heard it many times and have read it myself more than a few times. For many of us, including until recently myself, there may be a problem in how we interpret what Bill has written. Just what is the Great Fact for us?

The penultimate paragraph (Paragraph 1) contains the following two sentences: "See to it that your relationship with Him is right, and great events will come to pass for you and countless others. This is the Great Fact for us".

The last paragraph (Paragraph 2) begins with the following four sentences: "Abandon yourself to God as you understand God. Admit your faults to Him and to your fellows. Clear away the wreckage of your past. Give freely of what you find and join us." Whether we are reading these paragraphs ourselves or they are being read to us, there is usually not much of a pause between Paragraph 1 and Paragraph 2, so many of us come to believe that the great fact for us is presented in Paragraph 2, i.e., "Abandon yourself to God......"

Actually, the Great Fact for us is: "See to it that your relationship with Him is right, and great events will come to pass for you and countless others." When Bill writes: "This is the Great Fact for us.", the pronoun "this" refers to the previous sentence. He then ends Paragraph 1. Paragraph 2 begins a new thought, namely, a few instructions on how to make our relationship with Him right. Those four sentences effectively put our program into a nutshell!

How many times have I been told that Step 6 and Step 7 are only discussed briefly in the big book, specifically on page 76. A more in depth study can be found in the 12 and 12 which gives some excellent insight on the matter.

My personal experience following my 5th step was this. It was recommended I go home and find some place to be quiet as the book and my sponsor recommended, review the first 5 steps and examine to see that I was as thorough as I could be. I was to be quiet and reflect on them and what lies ahead. I thought I was going to have an epiphany of some sort as I sat in my closed office at home with my young sons making a racket downstairs. There was no sun beam or shaft of light that came in through the window and I did not experience riotous excitement nor serenity. It was then that I realized that this was going to take quite a bit more time. It was also no longer just about alcohol.

I had just given titles to the "defects of character." The 12 and 12 describes them as the seven sins. My fourth step, Big Book, and sponsor described them as selfishness, self-seeking, fear, pride, resentment, ego, just to name a few. Instincts gone awry! As I looked at these, it was easy to see how they were doing me

absolutely no good and in fact continued practice of them to new levels of perfection would likely lead me to drink. But for the first time in my life I was not afraid. One of the defects was being removed, a little.

As a symbol of what I had embarked on my sponsor brought a third chair to my 5th step. It remained empty for that time we were together, at least so I thought. It was his invitation to God to join us on the beginning of this life changing series of steps. This would be the reinforcement that there was something else working in my life and willing to help me if I would just ask. That relationship with Him was solidified then and there. I now had a power greater than myself I could rely upon as long as I was willing to count on Him and lean into in all times. I can honestly say I don't do that. I do it sometimes and am working on doing it more. The willingness to have these shortcomings removed comes, not all at once. Sometimes not one at a time, but it does arrive. Once I learned what they were and how objectionable they were not only to others but myself as well was I able to now develop and or ask for the willingness to be rid
